

ALFIE is a 1966 British comedy-drama starring Michael Caine. The narrative follows a young, womanizing man leading a self-centered life, focused on his own enjoyment until events force him to question his uncaring behavior, his loneliness, and his priorities. The song "Alfie", was penned by recently passed pop-composer Burt Bacharach.




SABRINA is a 1995 remake American romantic comedy-drama film directed by Sydney Pollack starring Harrison Ford and Julia Ormond as Sabrina. The film, a critical success, is a dramedy about a love triangle between rich brothers and Sabrina who is coming into her own. "Moonlight" is the Sting sung, John Williams wrtitten theme to Sabrina.



FIDDLER ON THE ROOF is a 1971 American period musical film set in early 20th-century Imperial Russia. the film centers on Tevye, played by Topol, a poor Jewish milkman who is faced with the challenge of marrying off his five daughters amidst the growing tension in his shtetl. "Matchmaker, Matchmaker" is one of the most popular songs from the musical and film. The musical score was composed by John Williams.



THE UMBRELLAS OF CHERBOURG is a 1964 musical romantic drama film written and directed by Jacques Demy, with music by Michel Legrand. Catherine Deneuve and Nino Castelnuovo star as two young lovers in the French city of Cherbourg, separated by circumstance. The film's dialogue is entirely sung as recitative and is sung-through like some operas and stage musicals. Umbrellas was nominated for five Academy Awards including the song, "I Will Wait For You".



CALAMITY JANE is a 1953 American Technicolor Western musical film starring Doris Day and Howard Keel, and directed by David Butler. The film is loosely based on the life of Wild West heroine Calamity Jane and explores an alleged romance between her and Wild Bill Hickok. Calamity won the Academy Award for Best Original Song for Fain and Websters "Secret Love".



COOL HAND LUKE is a 1967 American prison drama film directed by Stuart Rosenberg,[3] starring Paul Newman and featuring George Kennedy in an Oscar-winning performance. Newman stars in the title role as Luke, a prisoner in a Florida prison camp who refuses to submit to the system. "Down Here on the Ground" is one the memorable songs to come from Lalo Schifrin's award nominated score.




THE MUPPET MOVIE is a 1979 musical road comedy film produced by Jim Henson, and the first theatrical film to feature the Muppets. The film tells the origin story of the Muppets, as Kermit the Frog embarks on a cross-country trip to Los Angeles, encountering several of the Muppets—who all share the same ambition of finding success in professional show business. "Bein' Green" is one of the many favorite songs featured in the film.



DAYS OF WINE AND ROSES is a 1962 American romantic drama film directed by Blake Edwards with music by Henry Mancini and Johnny Mercer, features Jack Lemmon and Lee Remick. The film depicts the downward spiral of two average Americans who succumb to alcohol and attempt to deal with their problems. An Academy Award went to the film's theme music and was selected for preservation from the US Film Registry.



OLIVER! is a 1968 British period musical drama film based on Lionel Bart's 1960 stage musical of the same name, itself an adaptation of Charles Dickens's 1838 novel Oliver Twist. Directed by Carol Reed, it stars Ron Moody and Oliver Reed. Oliver! was nominated for eleven Academy Awards and won six. "Where is Love?" was Oliver's heartfelt ballad.



WILLY WONKA AND THE CHOCOLATE FACTORY is a 1971
American musical fantasy film based on Ronald Dahl's 1964
novel Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. It stars Gene Wilder
as Willy Wonka. The film is about a poor child named Charlie
Bucket who, upon finding a Golden Ticket in a chocolate bar,
wins the chance to visit Willy Wonka's chocolate factory
along with four other children from around the world. "Pure
Imagination", sung by Wilder is one of the standout songs.
